Expert Tips to Strengthen Bone

Vitamin D intake

Vitamin D is crucial for calcium absorption, and without it, our bodies cannot use calcium effectively. Exposure to sunlight is the best natural source of vitamin D, but it can be challenging to get enough, especially during the winter months. Foods like fatty fish (salmon, mackerel), egg yolks, and fortified foods (milk, orange juice) can contribute to your daily vitamin D intake.

Regular exercise

Weight-bearing exercises, such as walking, jogging, dancing, and weightlifting, help stimulate bone formation and strengthen existing bone density. Around 30 minutes of weight-bearing exercise most days of the week can significantly help boost bone strength. Additionally, balance and flexibility exercises, like yoga and tai chi, can help reduce the risk of falls and fractures.

Quit smoking and limit alcohol

Smoking has detrimental effects on bone health, as it interferes with the absorption of calcium and reduces estrogen levels in women, leading to decreased bone density. Excessive alcohol consumption is associated with the weakening of bones along with an increased risk of fractures. Limiting alcohol intake and quitting smoking will significantly benefit your bone health.

Maintain a healthy weight

Maintaining a healthy weight is necessary to boost bone health. Being underweight can lead to decreased bone density, while obesity increases the risk

of fractures due to added pressure on the bones. A balanced diet along with regular exercise can help maintain a healthy weight.

Minimize caffeine intake

High levels of caffeine intake have been associated with reduced calcium absorption and increased calcium excretion through urine. While moderate caffeine consumption is generally safe, excessive consumption, especially in the form of energy drinks, should be avoided for optimal bone health.

Avoid crash diets

Crash diets and extreme calorie restriction can lead to 2 nutrient deficiencies, including calcium and vitamin D, which are essential for bone health. Opt for balanced and sustainable dietary habits that provide all the necessary nutrients for strong bones.

Include magnesium and potassium in your diet

Magnesium and potassium are two more essential minerals for maintaining bone health. Magnesium supports bone formation and influences calcium metabolism, while potassium helps neutralize acids that can weaken bones. Incorporate foods like bananas, avocados, nuts, and whole grains to ensure you get an adequate intake of these vital minerals.

Get regular bone density screenings
